# Sexual Assault Awareness & Action Month



Since it was nationally recognized in 2001, April has marked Sexual Assault Awareness Month (SAAM), sparking month-long campaigns to increase awareness, prevention, and support for sexual assault survivors.

Even before its official declaration, SAAM was about both awareness and prevention of sexual assault, harassment, and abuse.

## But did you know we can trace its history even longer?

In the United States, movements for social change and push back towards gender based violence began to gain traction in the 1940s and 50s with the civil rights era. Efforts during this time were championed by women of color. Wide social activism around the issue of sexual assault continued into the 1970s; the first rape crisis center was founded in San Francisco in 1971.

We're so grateful to have Diana on our team and can't wait to see all the ways she continues to contribute to SASS and the communities we serve!




#### **SAAM Book Recommendations**
